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# ***Glossary of Acronyms, Terms, and Abbreviations***

**ABC** –Approved Budget for the Contract.

**BAC** – Bids and Awards Committee.

**Bid** – A signed offer or proposal to undertake a contract submitted by a bidder in response to and in consonance with the requirements of the bidding documents. Also referred to as *Proposal* and *Tender*. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[c])

**Bidder** – Refers to a contractor, manufacturer, supplier, distributor and/or consultant who submits a bid in response to the requirements of the Bidding Documents. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[d])

**Bidding Documents** – The documents issued by the Procuring Entity as the bases for bids, furnishing all information necessary for a prospective bidder to prepare a bid for the Goods, Infrastructure Projects, and/or Consulting Services required by the Procuring Entity. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[e])

**BIR** – Bureau of Internal Revenue.

**BSP** – BangkoSentral ng Pilipinas.

**Consulting Services** – Refer to services for Infrastructure Projects and other types of projects or activities of the GOP requiring adequate external technical and professional expertise that are beyond the capability and/or capacity of the GOP to undertake such as, but not limited to: (i) advisory and review services; (ii) pre-investment or feasibility studies; (iii) design; (iv) construction supervision; (v) management and related services; and (vi) other technical services or special studies. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[i])

**CDA** - Cooperative Development Authority.

**Contract** – Refers to the agreement entered into between the Procuring Entity and the Supplier or Manufacturer or Distributor or Service Provider for procurement of Goods and Services; Contractor for Procurement of Infrastructure Projects; or Consultant or Consulting Firm for Procurement of Consulting Services; as the case may be, as recorded in the Contract Form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.

**CIF** – Cost Insurance and Freight.

**CIP** – Carriage and Insurance Paid.

**CPI** – Consumer Price Index.

**DDP** – Refers to the quoted price of the Goods, which means “delivered duty paid.”

**DTI** – Department of Trade and Industry.

**EXW** – Ex works.

**FCA** – “Free Carrier” shipping point.

**FOB** – “Free on Board” shipping point.

**Foreign-funded Procurement or Foreign-Assisted Project**–Refers to procurement whose funding source is from a foreign government, foreign or international financing institution as specified in the Treaty or International or Executive Agreement. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[b]).

**Framework Agreement** – Refers to a written agreement between a procuring entity and a supplier or service provider that identifies the terms and conditions, under which specific purchases, otherwise known as “Call-Offs,” are made for the duration of the agreement. It is in the nature of an option contract between the procuring entity and the bidder(s) granting the procuring entity the option to either place an order for any of the goods or services identified in the Framework Agreement List or not buy at all, within a minimum period of one (1) year to a maximum period of three (3) years. (GPPB Resolution No. 27-2019)

**GFI** – Government Financial Institution.

**GOCC** –Government-owned and/or –controlled corporation.

**Goods** – Refer to all items, supplies, materials and general support services, except Consulting Services and Infrastructure Projects, which may be needed in the transaction of public businesses or in the pursuit of any government undertaking, project or activity, whether in the nature of equipment, furniture, stationery, materials for construction, or personal property of any kind, including non-personal or contractual services such as the repair and maintenance of equipment and furniture, as well as trucking, hauling, janitorial, security, and related or analogous services, as well as procurement of materials and supplies provided by the Procuring Entity for such services. The term “related” or “analogous services” shall include, but is not limited to, lease or purchase of office space, media advertisements, health maintenance services, and other services essential to the operation of the Procuring Entity. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[r])

**GOP** – Government of the Philippines.

**GPPB** – Government Procurement Policy Board.

**INCOTERMS** – International Commercial Terms.

**Infrastructure Projects** – Include the construction, improvement, rehabilitation, demolition, repair, restoration or maintenance of roads and bridges, railways, airports,

seaports, communication facilities, civil works components of information technology projects, irrigation, flood control and drainage, water supply, sanitation, sewerage and solid waste management systems, shore protection, energy/power and electrification facilities, national buildings, school buildings, hospital buildings, and other related construction projects of the government. Also referred to as *civil works or works*. (2016 revised IRR, Section 5[u])

**LGUs** – Local Government Units.

**NFCC** – Net Financial Contracting Capacity.

**NGA** – National Government Agency.

**PhilGEPS** - Philippine Government Electronic Procurement System.

**Procurement Project** – refers to a specific or identified procurement covering goods, infrastructure project or consulting services. A Procurement Project shall be described, detailed, and scheduled in the Project Procurement Management Plan prepared by the agency which shall be consolidated in the procuring entity's Annual Procurement Plan. (GPPB Circular No. 06-2019 dated 17 July 2019)

**PSA** – Philippine Statistics Authority.

**SEC** – Securities and Exchange Commission.

**SLCC** – Single Largest Completed Contract.

**Supplier** – refers to a citizen, or any corporate body or commercial company duly organized and registered under the laws where it is established, habitually established in business and engaged in the manufacture or sale of the merchandise or performance of the general services covered by his bid. (Item 3.8 of GPPB Resolution No. 13-2019, dated 23 May 2019). Supplier as used in these Bidding Documents may likewise refer to a distributor, manufacturer, contractor, or consultant.

## INVITATION TO BID FOR THE PROCUREMENT OF FOOD AND BEVERAGE AND RESTAURANT SERVICES PROVIDER FOR CASINO CUSTOMERS, CLIENTS AND GUESTS FOR PAGCOR CASINO FILIPINO-ILOILO FOR A PERIOD OF TWO (2) YEARS *under ITB No. CB23-07-006BAC*

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1. The Philippine Amusement and Gaming Corporation (PAGCOR), through the PAGCOR's Corporate Budget for CY 2023 intends to apply the sum of **Fourteen Million Five Hundred Thousand Pesos only (Php 14,500,000.00)**, VAT Exclusive, Zero-Rated Transaction, being the total ABC to payments under the contract for the Procurement of Food and Beverage and Restaurant Services Provider for Casino Customers, Clients and Guests for PAGCOR Casino Filipino – Iloilo for a period of Two (2) Years under ITB No. CB23-07-006BAC.

Bids received in excess of the ABC shall be automatically rejected at bid opening.

2. The PAGCOR now invites bids for the above Procurement Project. The complete schedule of deliveries is provided in the Section VI (Schedule of Requirements) of the Bidding Documents which will commence from the date of receipt by the winning supplier of the Notice to Proceed. Bidders should have completed, within **three (3) years** from the date of submission and receipt of bids, similar to the Project. The description of an eligible bidder is contained in the Bidding Documents, particularly, in Section II (Instructions to Bidders).
3. Bidding will be conducted through open competitive bidding procedures using a non-discretionary "*pass/fail*" criterion as specified in the 2016 revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act (RA) No. 9184.

Bidding is restricted to Filipino citizens/sole proprietorships, partnerships, or organizations with at least sixty percent (60%) interest or outstanding capital stock belonging to citizens of the Philippines, and to citizens or organizations of a country the laws or regulations of which grant similar rights or privileges to Filipino citizens, pursuant to RA No. 5183.

4. Prospective Bidders may obtain further information from PAGCOR and interested bidders may inspect and obtain further information from the Procurement Section (PS), acting as the BAC Secretariat, of PAGCOR and/or inspect the Bidding Documents at the Ground Floor PAGCOR, Casino Filipino – Bacolod, 15th Corner Aguinaldo Street Bacolod City during office hours of PAGCOR from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
5. A complete set of Bidding Documents may be acquired by interested Bidders starting on **July 11, 2023 (Tuesday)** until **July 31, 2023 (Monday)** from the given address and website(s) below upon payment of **Twenty-Five Thousand Pesos (Php 25,000.00)** for the Bidding Documents, pursuant to the latest Guidelines issued by the GPPB,

PAGCOR shall allow the bidder to present its proof of payment for the fees either in person, by facsimile, or through electronic means.

Prospective bidders may also download the Bidding Documents free of charge from [www.pagcor.ph](http://www.pagcor.ph) and [www.philgeps.gov.ph](http://www.philgeps.gov.ph) and may be allowed to submit bids provided that bidders pay the applicable fee of the Bidding Documents not later than the deadline for the submission and receipt of bids.

In effecting payment for the Bidding Documents, prospective bidders shall present either the Payment Slip, which may be secured from the PS, or a copy of this Invitation to Bid (ITB) to **Finance Section of CF-Bacolod, located at Second (2nd) Floor PAGCOR, Casino Filipino – Bacolod 15th Corner Aguinaldo Street Bacolod City.**

6. The PAGCOR will hold a Pre-Bid Conference on **July 19, 2023 (Wednesday), 10:30 am Ground Floor, Procurement Office, PAGCOR, Casino Filipino – Bacolod 15th Corner Aguinaldo Street Bacolod City** which shall be open to prospective bidders.
7. Bids must be duly received by the BAC Secretariat through manual submission on or before **July 31, 2023 (Monday), 1:00 pm, Ground Floor, Procurement Office, PAGCOR, Casino Filipino – Bacolod 15th Corner Aguinaldo Street Bacolod City.** Late bids shall not be accepted.
8. All Bids must be accompanied by a bid security in any of the acceptable forms and in the amount stated in **ITB Clause 14.**
9. Bid opening shall be on **July 31, 2023 (Monday), 1:00 pm** onwards at the **Ground Floor, Procurement Office, PAGCOR, Casino Filipino – Bacolod 15th Corner Aguinaldo Street Bacolod City for the Opening and Preliminary Examination of Bids.** Bids will be opened in the presence of the bidders' representatives who choose to attend the activity.
10. Bidders shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of their bids, and PAGCOR will in no case, be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.


Bidders should note that PAGCOR will only accept bids from those that have paid the applicable fee for the Bidding Documents.

PAGCOR assumes no responsibility whatsoever to compensate or indemnify bidders for any expenses incurred in the preparation of their bids.

In accordance with Government Procurement Policy Board (GPPB) Circular 06-2005 - Tie-Breaking Method, the Bids and Awards Committee (BAC) shall use a non-discretionary and non-discriminatory measure based on sheer luck or chance, which is "DRAW LOTS," in the event that two (2) or more bidders have been post-qualified and determined as the bidder having the Lowest Calculated Responsive Bid (LCRB) to determine the final bidder having the LCRB, based on the following procedures:

- a) In alphabetical order, the bidders shall pick one rolled paper.



- b) The lucky bidder who would pick the paper with a “CONGRATULATIONS” remark shall be declared as the final bidder having the LCRB and recommended for award of the contract.
11. The PAGCOR reserves the right to reject any and all bids, declare a failure of bidding, or not award the contract at any time prior to contract award in accordance with Sections 35.6 and 41 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected bidder or bidders.

## ***Section II. Instructions to Bidders***



## 1. Scope of Bid

The Procuring Entity, Philippine Amusement and Gaming Corporation (PAGCOR), wishes to receive Bids for the **Procurement of Food and Beverage and Restaurant Services Provider for Casino Customers, Clients and Guests for PAGCOR Casino Filipino – Iloilo for a period of Two (2) Years under ITB No. CB23-07-006BAC** with a total Approved Budget for the Contract (ABC) in the amount of **Fourteen Million Five Hundred Thousand Pesos (PhP14,500,000.00), VAT Exclusive, Zero-Rated Transaction.**

The Procurement Project (referred to herein as “Project”) is composed of one (1) lot, the details of which are described in Section VII (Technical Specifications).

## 2. Funding Information

- 2.1. The GOP through the source of funding as indicated below for **CY 2023** in the amount of **Fourteen Million Five Hundred Thousand Pesos (PhP14,500,000.00)** VAT Exclusive, Zero-Rated Transaction.
- 2.2. The source of funding is the Corporate Operating Budget – PAGCOR’s Corporate Budget for **CY 2023.**

## 3. Bidding Requirements

The Bidding for the Project shall be governed by all the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR, including its Generic Procurement Manuals and associated policies, rules and regulations as the primary source thereof, while the herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source thereof.

Any amendments made to the IRR and other GPPB issuances shall be applicable only to the ongoing posting, advertisement, or **IB** by the BAC through the issuance of a supplemental or bid bulletin.

The Bidder, by the act of submitting its Bid, shall be deemed to have verified and accepted the general requirements of this Project, including other factors that may affect the cost, duration and execution or implementation of the contract, project, or work and examine all instructions, forms, terms, and project requirements in the Bidding Documents.

## 4. Corrupt, Fraudulent, Collusive, and Coercive Practices

The Procuring Entity, as well as the Bidders and Suppliers, shall observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of the contract. They or through an agent shall not engage in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, and obstructive practices defined under Annex “I” of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 or other integrity violations in competing for the Project.

## 5. Eligible Bidders

- 5.1. Only Bids of Bidders found to be legally, technically, and financially capable will be evaluated.
- 5.2. Foreign ownership limited to those allowed under the rules may participate in this Project.
- 5.3. Pursuant to Section 23.4.1.3 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No.9184, the Bidder shall have an SLCC that is at least one (1) contract similar to the Project the value of which, adjusted to current prices using the PSA's CPI, must be at least equivalent to at least Fifty percent (50%) of the ABC in the amount of **Seven Million Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Pesos (Php 7,250,000.00)**
- 5.4. The Bidders shall comply with the eligibility criteria under Section 23.4.1 of the 2016 IRR of RA No. 9184.

## 6. Origin of Goods

There is no restriction on the origin of goods other than those prohibited by a decision of the UN Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the UN, subject to Domestic Preference requirements under **ITB** Clause 18.

## 7. Subcontracts

- 7.1. The Bidder may subcontract portions of the Project to the extent allowed by the Procuring Entity as stated herein, but in no case more than twenty percent (20%) of the Project.

The Procuring Entity has prescribed that Subcontracting is not allowed.

## 8. Pre-Bid Conference

The Procuring Entity will hold a pre-bid conference for this Project on the specified date and time at its physical address as indicated in paragraph 6 of the **IB**.

## 9. Clarification and Amendment of Bidding Documents

Prospective bidders may request for clarification on and/or interpretation of any part of the Bidding Documents. Such requests must be in writing and received by the Procuring Entity, either at its given address or through electronic mail indicated in the **IB**, at least ten (10) calendar days before the deadline set for the submission and receipt of Bids.

## 10. Documents comprising the Bid: Eligibility and Technical Components

- 10.1. The first envelope shall contain the eligibility and technical documents of the Bid as specified in **Section VIII (Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents)**.

- 10.2. The Bidder's SLCC as indicated in **ITB** Clause 5.3 should have been completed within **three (3) years** prior to the deadline for the submission and receipt of bids.
- 10.3. If the eligibility requirements or statements, the bids, and all other documents for submission to the BAC are in foreign language other than English, it must be accompanied by a translation in English, which shall be authenticated by the appropriate Philippine foreign service establishment, post, or the equivalent office having jurisdiction over the foreign bidder's affairs in the Philippines. Similar to the required authentication above, for Contracting Parties to the Apostille Convention, only the translated documents shall be authenticated through an apostille pursuant to GPPB Resolution No. 13-2019 dated 23 May 2019. The English translation shall govern, for purposes of interpretation of the bid.

## **11. Documents comprising the Bid: Financial Component**

- 11.1. The second bid envelope shall contain the financial documents for the Bid as specified in **Section VIII (Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents)**.
- 11.2. If the Bidder claims preference as a Domestic Bidder or Domestic Entity, a certification issued by DTI shall be provided by the Bidder in accordance with Section 43.1.3 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 11.3. Any bid exceeding the ABC indicated in paragraph 1 of the **IB** shall not be accepted.
- 11.4. For Foreign-funded Procurement, a ceiling may be applied to bid prices provided the conditions are met under Section 31.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

## **12. Bid Prices**

- 12.1. Prices indicated on the Price Schedule shall be entered separately in the following manner:
  - a. For Goods offered from within the Procuring Entity's country:
    - i. The price of the Goods quoted EXW (ex-works, ex-factory, ex-warehouse, ex-showroom, or off-the-shelf, as applicable);
    - ii. The cost of all customs duties and sales and other taxes already paid or payable;
    - iii. The cost of transportation, insurance, and other costs incidental to delivery of the Goods to their final destination; and

- iv. The price of other (incidental) services, if any, listed in e.
- b. For Goods offered from abroad:
  - i. Unless otherwise stated in the **BDS**, the price of the Goods shall be quoted delivered duty paid (DDP) with the place of destination in the Philippines as specified in the **BDS**. In quoting the price, the Bidder shall be free to use transportation through carriers registered in any eligible country. Similarly, the Bidder may obtain insurance services from any eligible source country.
  - ii. The price of other (incidental) services, if any, as listed in **Section VII (Technical Specifications)**.

### 13. Bid and Payment Currencies

- 13.1. For Goods that the Bidder will supply from outside the Philippines, the bid prices may be quoted in the local currency or tradeable currency accepted by the BSP at the discretion of the Bidder. However, for purposes of bid evaluation, Bids denominated in foreign currencies, shall be converted to Philippine currency based on the exchange rate as published in the BSP reference rate bulletin on the day of the bid opening.
- 13.2. Payment of the contract price shall be made in Philippine Pesos.

### 14. Bid Security

- 14.1. The Bidder shall submit a Bid Securing Declaration or any form of Bid Security in the amount indicated in the **BDS**, which shall be not less than the percentage of the ABC in accordance with the schedule in the **BDS**.
- 14.2. The Bid and bid security shall be valid for one hundred twenty (120) calendar days from the date of the Submission, Opening and Preliminary Examination of Bids. Any Bid not accompanied by an acceptable bid security shall be rejected by the Procuring Entity as non-responsive.

### 15. Sealing and Marking of Bids

Each Bidder shall submit one copy of the first and second components of its Bid.

The Procuring Entity may request additional hard copies and/or electronic copies of the Bid. However, failure of the Bidders to comply with the said request shall not be a ground for disqualification.

If the Procuring Entity allows the submission of bids through online submission or any other electronic means, the Bidder shall submit an electronic copy of its Bid, which must be digitally signed. An electronic copy that cannot be opened

or is corrupted shall be considered non-responsive and, thus, automatically disqualified.

## 16. Deadline for Submission of Bids

16.1. The Bidders shall submit on the specified date and time at its physical address as indicated in paragraph 7 of the **IB**.

## 17. Opening and Preliminary Examination of Bids

17.1. The BAC shall open the Bids in public at the time, on the date, and at the place specified in paragraph 9 of the **IB**. The Bidders' representatives who are present shall sign a register evidencing their attendance. In case videoconferencing, webcasting or other similar technologies will be used, attendance of participants shall likewise be recorded by the BAC Secretariat.

In case the Bids cannot be opened as scheduled due to justifiable reasons, the rescheduling requirements under Section 29 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall prevail.

17.2. The preliminary examination of bids shall be governed by Section 30 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

## 18. Domestic Preference

18.1. The Procuring Entity will grant a margin of preference for the purpose of comparison of Bids in accordance with Section 43.1.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

## 19. Detailed Evaluation and Comparison of Bids

19.1. The Procuring BAC shall immediately conduct a detailed evaluation of all Bids rated "*passed*," using non-discretionary pass/fail criteria. The BAC shall consider the conditions in the evaluation of Bids under Section 32.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

19.2. If the Project allows partial bids, bidders may submit a proposal on any of the lots or items, and evaluation will be undertaken on a per lot or item basis, as the case maybe. In this case, the Bid Security as required by **ITB** Clause 15 shall be submitted for each lot or item separately.

19.3. The descriptions of the lots or items shall be indicated in **Section VII (Technical Specifications)**, although the ABCs of these lots or items are indicated in the **BDS** for purposes of the NFCC computation pursuant to Section 23.4.2.6 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184. The NFCC must be sufficient for the total of the ABCs for all the lots or items participated in by the prospective Bidder.

**19.4.** The Project shall be awarded as One (1) Project **having several items which shall be awarded as one (1) lot.**

19.5. Except for bidders submitting a committed Line of Credit from a Universal or Commercial Bank in lieu of its NFCC computation, all Bids must include the NFCC computation pursuant to Section 23.4.1.4 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184, which must be sufficient for the total of the **ABC of the project.** For bidders submitting the committed Line of Credit, it must be at least equal to ten percent (10%) of the **ABC of the project.**

## **20. Post-Qualification**

20.2 Within a non-extendible period of five (5) calendar days from receipt by the Bidder of the notice from the BAC that it submitted the Lowest/Single Calculated Bid, the Bidder shall submit its latest income and business tax returns filed and paid through the BIR Electronic Filing and Payment System (eFPS) and other appropriate licenses and permits required by law and stated in the **BDS.**

## **21. Signing of the Contract**

21.1. The documents required in Section 37.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall form part of the Contract. Additional Contract documents are indicated in the **BDS.**

## ***Section IV. General Conditions of Contract***



## 1. Scope of Contract

This Contract shall include all such items, although not specifically mentioned, that can be reasonably inferred as being required for its completion as if such items were expressly mentioned herein. All the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR, including the Generic Procurement Manual, and associated issuances, constitute the primary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract, and thus, applicable in contract implementation. Herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract.

This is without prejudice to Sections 74.1 and 74.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 allowing the GPPB to amend the IRR, which shall be applied to all procurement activities, the advertisement, posting, or invitation of which were issued after the effectivity of the said amendment.

Additional requirements for the completion of this Contract shall be provided in the **Special Conditions of Contract (SCC)**.

## 2. Advance Payment and Terms of Payment

2.1. Advance payment of the contract amount is provided under Annex "D" of the revised 2016 IRR of RA No. 9184.

2.2. The Procuring Entity is allowed to determine the terms of payment on the partial or staggered delivery of the Goods procured, provided such partial payment shall correspond to the value of the goods delivered and accepted in accordance with prevailing accounting and auditing rules and regulations. The terms of payment are indicated in the **SCC**.

## 3. Performance Security

Within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of the Notice of Award by the Bidder from the Procuring Entity but in no case later than prior to the signing of the Contract by both parties, the successful Bidder shall furnish the performance security in any of the forms prescribed in Section 39 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

## 4. Inspection and Tests

All reasonable facilities and assistance for the inspection and testing of Goods, including access to drawings and production data, shall be provided by the Supplier to the authorized inspectors at no charge to the Procuring Entity.

## **5. Warranty**

- 5.1. In order to assure that manufacturing defects shall be corrected by the Supplier, a warranty shall be required from the Supplier as provided under Section 62.1 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 5.2. The Procuring Entity shall promptly notify the Supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty. Upon receipt of such notice, the Supplier shall, repair or replace the defective Goods or parts thereof without cost to the Procuring Entity, pursuant to the Generic Procurement Manual.

## **6. Liability of the Supplier**

The Supplier's liability under this Contract shall be as provided by the laws of the Republic of the Philippines.

If the Supplier is a joint venture, all partners to the joint venture shall be jointly and severally liable to the Procuring Entity.

## SERVICE CONTRACT

This PURCHASE CONTRACT (the “**CONTRACT**”) is entered into and executed by and between:

**PHILIPPINE AMUSEMENT AND GAMING CORPORATION (PAGCOR)**, a government-owned and controlled corporation created and existing by virtue of Presidential Decree 1869, as amended, with office address at the PAGCOR Executive Office, New Coast Hotel Manila, M.H Del Pilar cor. Pedro Gil Sts. Malate, Manila, represented in this act by its \_\_\_\_\_, hereinafter referred to as “**PAGCOR**”;

-and-

\_\_\_\_\_ a corporation OR sole proprietorship duly organized and existing under the laws of the Republic of the Philippines OR duly registered with the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) with DTI Reference No. \_\_\_\_\_, with office address at \_\_\_\_\_, represented in this act by its \_\_\_\_\_, duly authorized for this purpose by a (Secretary’s Certificate / Special Power of Attorney) dated \_\_\_\_\_, hereto attached as Annex “A”, hereinafter referred to as the “**SUPPLIER**”.

### **ANTECEDENTS:**

**WHEREAS, PAGCOR** has a requirement for the *Procurement of Food and Beverage and Restaurant Services Provider for Casino Customers, Clients and Guests for PAGCOR Casino Filipino – Iloilo for a period of Two (2) Years* under ITB No. CB23-07-006BAC, which was approved by the PAGCOR Board of Directors and included in the 2023 Annual Procurement Plan (APP);

**WHEREAS, PAGCOR** conducted a Competitive Bidding in accordance with the Republic Act 9184 (Government Procurement Reform Act) and its 2016 Revised Implementing Rules and Regulations on July 11, 2023 for the procurement of the Project;

**WHEREAS,** the **SUPPLIER** has submitted the lowest/single calculated responsive bid for the Project;

**WHEREAS,** considering that all the requisites were met, **PAGCOR** has accepted the bid of the **SUPPLIER**;

**WHEREAS**, the Branch Manager, duly delegated on June 01, 2022, approved the award of the contract to the **SUPPLIER**;

**NOW, THEREFORE**, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements hereunder specified, **PAGCOR** and the **SUPPLIER** hereby enter into this Purchase Contract under the following terms, conditions and specifications:

### I. SCOPE OF SERVICES

The CONTRACTOR undertakes to provide the Services, specifically, the provision of meals and/or snacks and the incidental services for sanitation and cleaning, including all the necessary labor, materials, supplies and equipment, to PAGCOR, Casino Filipino – Bacolod, in accordance with the menu as attached herein as Annex “A” and technical specifications;

<b>QUALIFICATIONS:</b>
1. The Service Provider/Supplier should have proven track record in the restaurant industry for a minimum of three (3) years as of the time of submission of bids.
2. The restaurant of the Service Provider/Supplier should be able to serve various local and international cuisines, to include, but not limited to, Filipino, Ilonggo, American, Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Italian, etc., to cater to different types of nationalities & food preferences, including options for vegetarian, halal, etc., meals and beverages.
<b>VENUE:</b>
1. The Service Provider/Supplier should be located within the building occupied by PAGCOR Casino Filipino – Iloilo, adjacent to but outside the PAGCOR leased or occupied area.
2. The Service Provider/Supplier must be able to operate twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week (24/7), in order to serve the needs of the casino customers and guests anytime or in accordance with the casino gaming operations of the PAGCOR Casino Filipino – Iloilo.
<b>FOOD REQUIREMENTS (MENU):</b>
1. The meals and/or beverages offered by the Service Provider/Supplier to the customers/guests and contained in the menu shall be mutually agreed upon by PAGCOR and the Service Provider/Supplier and shall form part of the terms and conditions of this contract.
2. All goods/services offered must be of highest quality and in accordance with PAGCOR's standards, taking into consideration further the standards and preferences of PAGCOR's customers/clientele and/or guests.
3. The menu shall consist of varied selections of vegetables, fruits, rice, bread and/or pastry, pork, beef, chicken, fish and seafood.
4. The menu shall offer meals prepared in different flavors and methods of cooking, e.g. broiled, steamed, baked, grilled, sautéed, fried and/or fresh, as the case may be.

5. The menu shall include, but will not be limited to, items for breakfast, lunch, dinner and/or snacks, which may be served at anytime.

6. The menu shall include appetizers, bar chow, salads, pasta/noodles, dim sum, sandwiches, baked breads and/or pastry, desserts and/or cakes, alcoholic and non-alcoholic beverages, etc.

7. The Service Provider/Supplier shall ensure that its menu selections shall be well-stocked and always be available at any time. The availability of the menu items that will be agreed upon shall only be limited by the following: reasonable seasonal supply variations, actual market in availability, actual severe market price fluctuations and/or government supply restrictions. The Service Provider/Supplier shall always endeavor to ensure its ability to provide the casino with its food and beverage requirements and restaurant services.

**PERSONNEL AND STAFF:**

1. The Service Provider/Supplier shall provide sufficient manpower to meet the operation schedule that is required by PAGCOR Casino Filipino - Iloilo.

2. The Service Provider/Supplier must provide at least two (2) personnel at all times and such additional manpower depending on the number of meals to be prepared/served as well as the number of clients to be attended to within the casino premises, and to ensure efficient restaurant and kitchen operations.

The personnel functions employed for the restaurant/kitchen operation must include:

- a) Chef or Chief Cook (as Kitchen In-Charge)
- b) Cooks on duty and/or kitchen helpers
- c) Waiters/Waitresses or Food Attendants/Servers
- d) Dishwashers or Bus staff or Janitor
- e) Cashier or Accountant
- f) Supervisor or Maitre d' or Manager (as Dining In-Charge)

3. The Service Provider/Supplier must ensure that its personnel shall wear the proper uniform at all times while on duty, as is appropriate for their designated functions, and observe personal hygiene standards throughout their duty including, but not limited to aprons, headdress/haircaps, gloves, etc.

4. The personnel of the Service Provider/Supplier must have a good personal hygiene, especially:

- a. Clean and well-trimmed finger nails without polish;
- b. Hair should be neat and tidy; and
- c. Any and/or all open wounds should be properly dressed

5. The personnel of the Service Provider/Supplier must observe the practice of "Clean As You Go" policy.

6. Health/sanitary permit/clearance are required for all personnel.

7. The Service Provider/Supplier shall comply with PAGCOR's standards and shall always take into consideration the special preferences of PAGCOR, its customers and guests.

**EQUIPMENT:**

1. The Service Provider/Supplier should possess and/or have access to all the necessary kitchen and restaurant supplies, utensils and equipment as part of the Service Provider/Supplier's due diligence in providing goods/services to the clientele and/or customers of PAGCOR, to include, but not limited to the following:

- a. Various dining and kitchen utensils (e.g. spoons, forks, knives and chopping boards, ladles, chopsticks, etc.);
- b. Various tableware including plates, glasses, cups and saucers, food platters, bowls, serving trays, trolleys, chafing dishes with covers, etc.;
- c. Various cookware, cooking implements and utensils;
- d. Various tablecloths, placemats, cloth and paper napkins, and table decor;
- e. Stoves, grilles, ovens, microwaves, steamers, and other gas or electric cooking and heating devices;
- f. Freezers, Refrigerators, Chillers, dispensers, and other food and beverage cooling devices;
- g. Spices and clean containers for the different food ingredients;
- h. Various sanitary equipment such as food and kitchen waste management devices, covered bins, cleaning and dishwashing devices, and other supplies and materials.

2. The Service Provider must provide a Certificate of Occupancy from the building owner where the casino is housed for the space it will occupy to conduct its business operations.


3. The Service Provider must adhere to all applicable national government regulations, the local government (Iloilo City) food safety and health regulations and PAGCOR Health and Safety Protocols and guidelines.

**FOOD HANDLING:**

1. All kitchen utensils must always be sterilized.

2. All plates, cups, glasses and saucers should always be properly cleaned and dried.

3. Chopping boards must not be used interchangeably for raw and cooked foods. Wooden chopping boards should not be used.



4. Salads that are prepared in advance must be properly stored and transported in a cold temperature.
5. Heating of food must be available upon request of the customer.
<b>ACTUAL FOOD DELIVERY:</b>
1. Hot food should be served hot, cold food should be served cold.
2. The Service Provider/Supplier must take exercise extra-ordinary diligence to avoid food contamination and/or food poisoning.
3. Food arrangement should be attractive and garnished
4. Texture and consistency should be observed accordingly.
<b>F &amp; B CONTRACT PRICE</b>
1. The total contract price for this Service Contract shall be Fourteen Million Five Hundred Thousand PESOS (PHP14,500,000.00), VAT-Exclusive, Zero-Rated Transaction, for a period of Two (2) years or upon exhaustion of the contract price, whichever comes first (the "Contract Price").
2. Payment shall be based on actual billing and consumption and shall not exceed the total contract price and shall be subjected to the appropriate withholding taxes.
<b>NOTES:</b>
1. The unit cost per meal shall be based on the unit cost reflected in the menu/price list as mutually agreed upon by both parties. Supplier/provider should attach the latest menu/pricelist as part of the submittal.

This Service Contract, and all rights and interest herein, may not be assigned or sub-contracted to another without the consent of the other party.

In the event that facts and circumstances arise or discovered which render this Contract disadvantageous to the Government, as determined by PAGCOR, the parties hereto agree to immediately renegotiate its terms and conditions, or at the option of PAGCOR, terminate the same.



This Service Contract constitutes the entire agreement between the parties pertaining to the subject matter contained in it and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous contracts, representations, warranties and understandings of the parties. No supplement, variation or amendment to this Service Contract shall be binding unless executed in writing by all the parties thereto.

## II. CONTRACT PRICE and SCHEDULE OF PAYMENT

1. The total contract price for this Service Contract shall be \_\_\_\_\_, VAT-Exclusive, Zero-Rated Transaction for a period of two (2) years (the "Contract Price").
2. Payment shall be based on actual consumption and billing and shall be subject to the appropriate withholding taxes.

4. The CONTRACTOR shall submit a VAT-Exclusive and Zero-Rated billing statement to PAGCOR every month together with the corresponding coupons/ invoices duly signed by the qualified guests and authorized officers of Casino Filipino-Angeles and countersigned by a duly authorized PAGCOR representative. However, F&B items / billings found unsatisfactory and/or not conformed to by PAGCOR shall not be paid. PAGCOR shall pay the billing statement within thirty (30) calendar days from its receipt of the billing statement provided that any additional, necessary and/or required supporting documents are submitted by the CONTRACTOR and are verified by PAGCOR.
5. PAGCOR shall not be liable for any other costs except as provided for under this Contract.

## III. CONTRACT TERM

This Contract shall be effective from the date indicated in the Notice to Proceed. However, this Contract shall be automatically terminated if the Contract Price is exhausted before the termination date.

PAGCOR may terminate this Contract with or without cause, without need for judicial intervention, and without incurring any obligation whatsoever, upon thirty (30) days written notice to the CONTRACTOR.

Should the SUPPLIER incurs delay or fails to satisfactorily deliver any or all of the goods/items required under the CONTRACT within the specified schedule, inclusive of any time extension duly granted, the SUPPLIER shall be liable for liquidated damages equivalent to one-tenth (1/10) of one percent (1%) of the cost of the delayed goods/items

for each day of delay, including Sundays and Holidays, until such goods/items are finally delivered and accepted by PAGCOR.

Such liquidated damages shall be paid by the SUPPLIER or deducted from any money due or which may become due to the SUPPLIER, or collected from any applicable securities or warranties posted by the SUPPLIER.

In case the total sum of liquidated damages reaches ten percent (10%) of the total contract price, PAGCOR may rescind or automatically terminate the Contract and impose appropriate sanctions over and above the liquidated damages to be paid.

#### **IV. NO EMPLOYER-EMPLOYEE OR AGENCY/PARTNERSHIP RELATIONSHIP**

1. There shall be no employer-employee relationship between PAGCOR and the employees of the CONTRACTOR. The CONTRACTOR shall have the entire charge, control and supervision of the Services herein agreed upon. The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for all acts and omissions of its agents, personnel and all persons allowed by it to have access to PAGCOR's premises, for any injury which may be caused to any person or property while remaining either casually or in business in any part of PAGCOR's premises. Any accident, injury or sickness of any kind, or death that may occur to any agent, personnel of the CONTRACTOR consequent to the performance of the Services under this Service Contract shall be the CONTRACTOR's sole responsibility. The CONTRACTOR further binds itself to indemnify and hold PAGCOR free and harmless from any claim on account of the aforementioned injuries or damages.

2. Any offense committed by any of the CONTRACTOR's personnel shall constitute a breach of this Service Contract. PAGCOR shall communicate to the CONTRACTOR all instances of such breach for immediate and appropriate action by the CONTRACTOR.

3. The CONTRACTOR shall comply with all of the obligations as an employer under the Labor Code, its implementing rules and regulations and all other applicable laws and regulations. Non-compliance therewith shall be for its exclusive risk and responsibility and shall constitute a violation of and a ground for the termination of its Service Contract.

4. The relationship between the parties shall be limited to the performance of the Services as stipulated under this Service Contract. Nothing herein shall be construed to create a general partnership between the parties, or to authorize any party to bind the other, except as set forth in this Service Contract, or to borrow money on behalf of another party, or to use the credit of any party for any purpose.

#### **V. WARRANTIES SECURITY**

1. The CONTRACTOR warrants that there are no actions, suits or proceedings pending or threatened, which may have a material adverse effect on its ability to fulfill its obligations under this Contract or on its operations, business, properties, assets or business condition.

2. All taxes, amounts, claims, and expenses pertaining to clearances, licenses, permits, registrations or renewals thereof, required by PAGCOR or the appropriate government entities for the Services to be performed under this Service Contract shall be for the exclusive account of the CONTRACTOR.

3. The CONTRACTOR shall pay its taxes in full and on time. The CONTRACTOR shall also present a tax clearance from the Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR) and a copy of its income and business tax returns, duly stamped, received and validated by the BIR, indicating the tax payments made thereon. Its failure to do so shall entitle PAGCOR to suspend payment for services rendered by the CONTRACTOR.

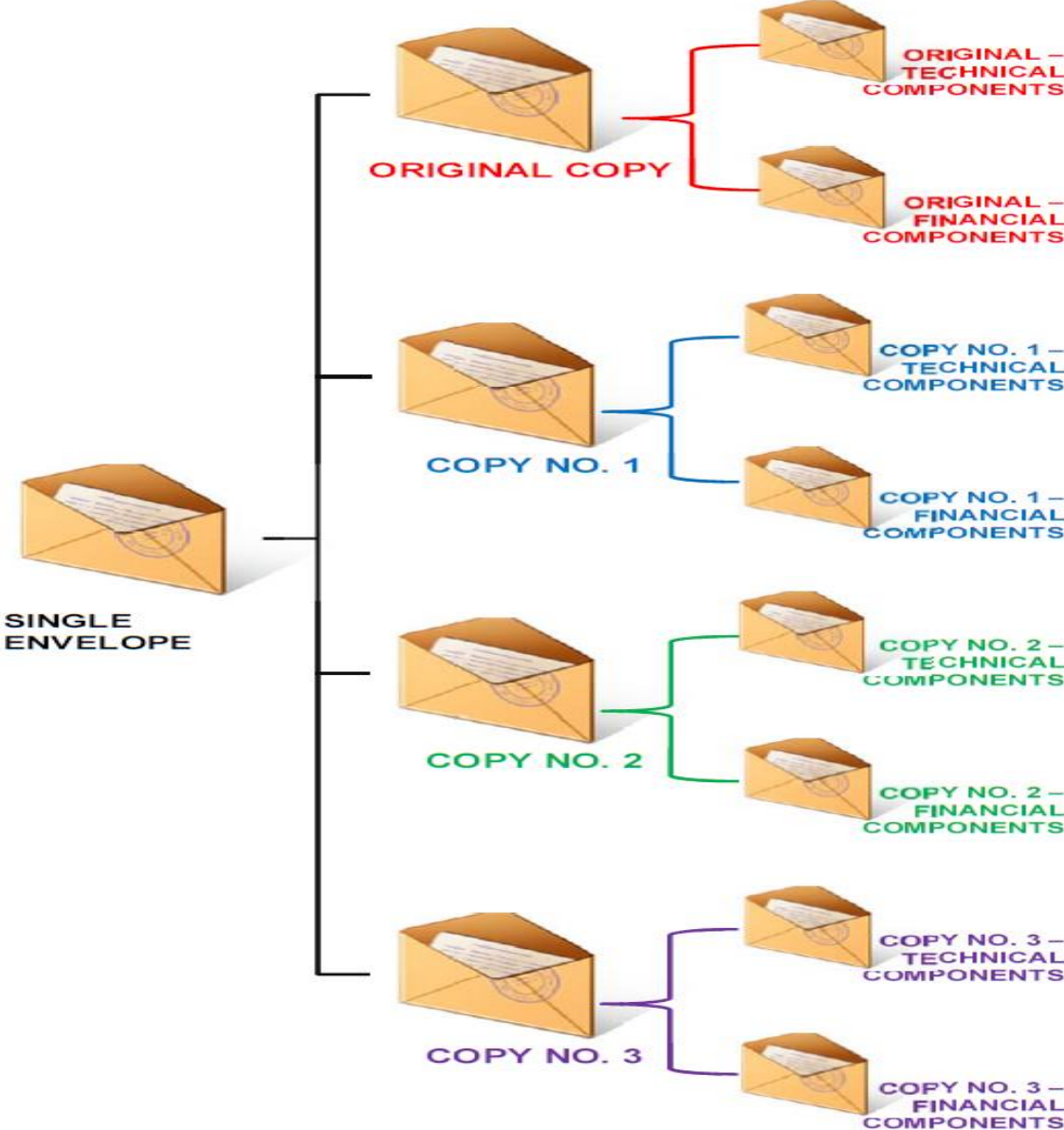

# DIAGRAM FOR THE SEALING AND MARKING OF BIDS

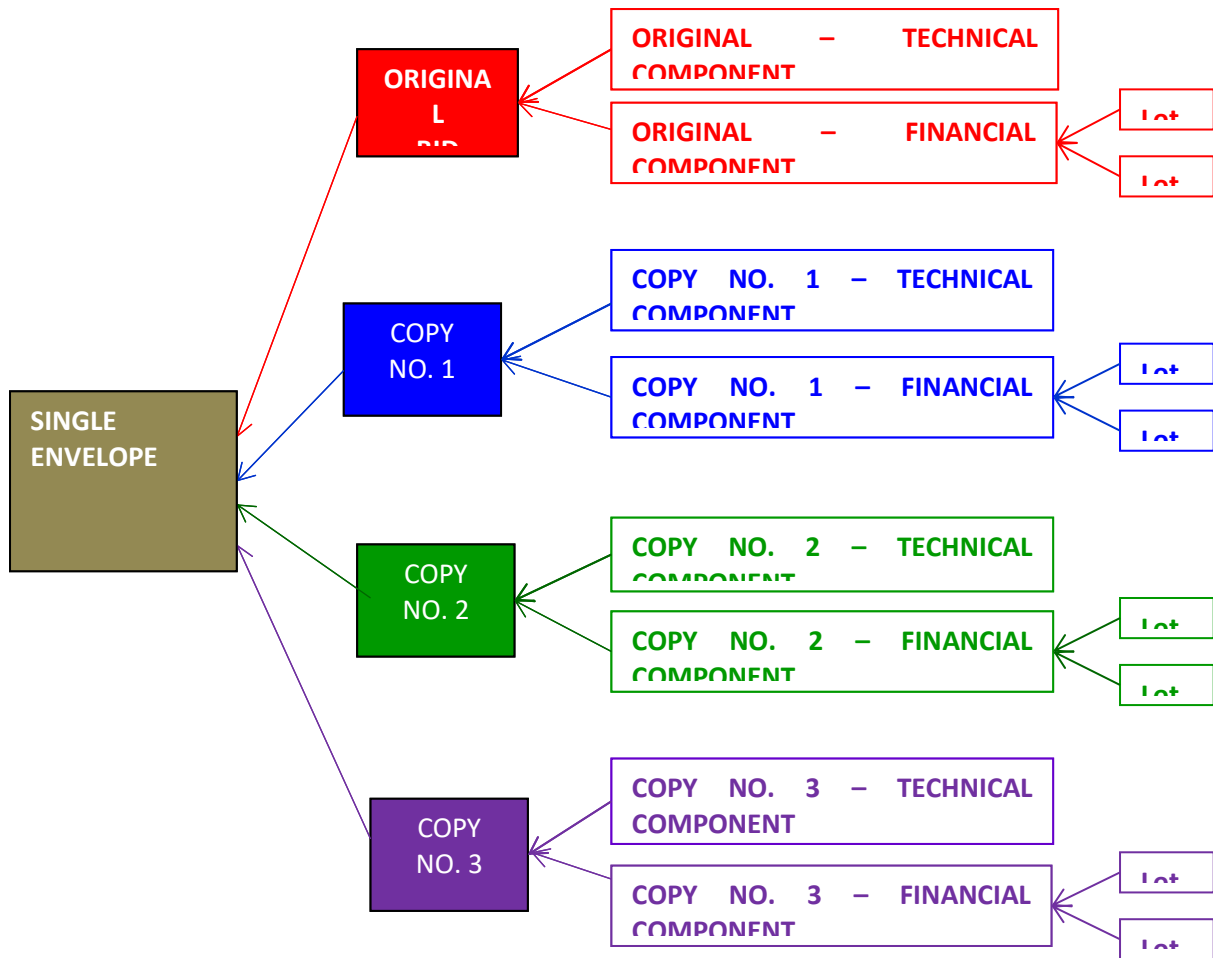
