



ELECTRONIC GAMING SYSTEM SERVICE PROVIDER REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

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Procedures for processing of applications for accreditation of Electronic Gaming System (EGS) Service Providers:

1. Applicant obtains the application form for accreditation of EGS Service Provider by downloading the “Electronic Gaming System (EGS) Service Provider Registration Form” from PAGCOR regulatory website.
2. Applicant provides information and fully accomplish the registration form and attach the applicant documentary requirements, which include among others the following:
 - a) Latest General Information Sheet (GIS) duly received by SEC
 - b) Articles of Incorporation, By-laws duly received by SEC, with Authorized Capital Stock of at least One Billion Pesos (PhP1 Billion) and Paid-up Capital Stock of at least Two Hundred Fifty Million Pesos (PhP250 Million)
 - c) Original bank certification with a minimum of One Hundred Million Pesos (PhP100 Million)

For the complete list of applicant documentary requirements, please refer to Item no. 3 of the Electronic Gaming System (EGS) Service Provider Registration Form.

3. All applications for accreditation are submitted to GLDD for evaluation.
4. Application will be returned if information and/or documentary requirements are incomplete.
5. If documentary requirements are complete, GLDD advises the Applicant to pay the Accreditation Fee.
6. The Applicant shall comply with the requirements prescribed in the Board-approved “Requirements for the Accreditation of Service Providers for Electronic Gaming Systems and Electronic Games (“EGS Service Provider”).
7. The Applicant shall comply with the accreditation procedures and requirements currently in place for a Supplier, or comply with accreditation procedures and requirements that PAGCOR may implement in the future.
8. PAGCOR inspection team conducts ocular site inspection of facility and testing of EGS Service Provider’s electronic gaming platform/system and games, player registration, income reporting, among others to determine capability and readiness of the EGS system to fulfill gaming services.

9. GLDD recommends to the Board of Directors the approval of the accreditation of Applicant as EGS Service Provider upon compliance with the following:
 - a) Submission of complete documentary requirements;
 - b) Payment of the proposed PhP2.5 Million Accreditation Fee
 - c) Satisfactory results of ocular inspection of EGS Service Provider's facility; and
 - d) Passed the prescribed probity requirements.
10. GLDD informs the Applicant of the approval of the accreditation.
11. The EGS Service Provider posts a bond equivalent to Twenty Five Million Pesos (PhP25 Million) through Letter of Credit or other similar documents prior to the live commercial operation of its electronic gaming.
12. The Certificate of Accreditation duly signed by the President and Chief Operating Officer shall be issued to the EGS Service Provider.
13. GLDD issues a Notice to Commence Electronic Gaming Operations before the EGS Service Provider commences actual live operations.
